
continue to be a light in the community. We are looking to thrive in the coming years and continue to be a place of excellence for Christ.

Vice Principal Mrs. Blotsky answers some frequently asked questions regarding Williston Trinity Christian School.

1. How can elementary parents help their students for school at home?

One of the ways that elementary parents can truly help their students at home is to **read aloud with them**. According to the National Education Association, reading aloud to children is not only one of the best activities to stimulate language and cognitive skills; it also builds motivation, curiosity, and memory. Another way to help your child at home is to **access the online learning program** that we offer at WTCS. Study Island supports student learning in kindergarten through grade 12. Through this online learning technology students are able to master grade-level skills in a fun and engaging manner. Study Island promotes learning in math, reading, writing, science, and social studies with interactive games that



reinforce and reward learning achievement. If you are interested in using Study Island at home, please contact the front office.

2. What is dual credit?_

Dual credit gives students the opportunity to **earn both high school credit and college credit for course work**. Many of these opportunities are done online with Williston State College, but we also offer on-campus opportunities at WTCS. On-campus at WTCS students can earn dual-credit in Chemistry and Spanish. Mrs. Laura Abuhl and Mrs. Melissa Corneliusen are two teachers on our campus who have their master degrees in their respective areas.

3. Why does WTCS have a different grading scale than most schools?_

WTCS strives for academic excellence. One of the ways we do this is with a higher grading scale for students in grades 4-12. At WTCS an 'A' is valued at a 100-94%, a 'B' is 93%-87%, a 'C' is 86%-78%, a 'D' is 77%-70%, and an 'F' is 69%-0%. At WTCS we believe that by having our students reaching for higher grade expectations they are more readily prepared for a collegiate grading scale. Often time in a collegiate institution the grade scale is 90%-100% for an 'A'. This is something that students from WTCS are able to adequately reach if they have been an 'A'-'B' student at WTCS.

4. How do we support our students	as the	y leave WTCS?
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We greatly value our Alumni. **WTCS** is always home for our students. We always encourage our students to 'come back home' to visit us and we are always open about staying in contact with our past students. I have had students many times calls for recommendations, encouragement, scholarship help, and even the occasional proof reading of an assignment. We are family at WTCS-family is forever.

5	What does	one school,	one	huildina	one	family	mean?
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The culture at WTCS is unmatched. We are truly a family. We house students in pre-school through grade 12 at WTCS. This allows us to be a 'one-stop shop for education' You can come to us and all of your children, who are school aged, can be under the same roof. This allows us to get to know our students and our families in a way that **allows us to invest in not only your child's education**, **but their life.**

As Vice Principal at WTCS I am honored and proud to witness the growth of each of our students, every single day, not just growth academically, but spiritually. We are raising up disciples of Christ. Our students are truly gifts from above, and their time at WTCS is invaluable. At WTCS we are sowing seeds that have not yet become fruit, and the beautiful fruit that will come from each seed we sow will be unsurmountable. 
